The prizes, awards and winners of raffles will be presented at about 3:30 p.m. on 25 July 2010 following the counting of all ballots cast by the visitors during the 3 day exhibit.

Note: This year's Photo Exhibit will open to all formats of photography and cameras and will have four of different categories.

Prize listing:

- \$50.00 plus a certificate for the image which receives the most votes in each category
- \$100.00 plus a certificate for the image which receives the most votes overall.
- Certificates for those entries which finish 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th in the voting for each category.
(Should there be a tie in any category in any position, prize money will be divided)

Participation guidelines for Photo Exhibit:

- Entries for the 9th Annual People's Choice Photo Exhibit will be accepted in the following categories, People, Animals, Landscapes and Artistic.
- Each entry must be accompanied by a copy of the official registration form and it must be clearly indicated on the form in which category the image is to be entered. There is to be no identification anywhere on the entry as to who created the entry.
- Any size of print or format can be submitted. It is recommended that for best viewing, an 8" x 10" print mounted on a rigid backing is best for display. Framing and matting is permitted, although not required. Basic print holders available at \$3.50
- Submissions must be able to be placed on an easel for viewing.
- Entries must be received before 12 pm, 23 July 2010 and each entry must be accompanied by a completed entry form in this brochure and self addressed, stamped envelope for returning entries if not being personally picked up at

1600 25 July 2010.

- Each entry will be assigned a number, which will be used by the voting visitors to indicate their favourite images on the ballots.
- There is no charge to enter the exhibit. The participants are being asked to support the ticket sales for a pair of outdoor cedar Adirondack chairs, valued at about \$250.00. Tickets \$2.00 each; 3 for \$5.00 or a book of 12 for \$18.00.
- All levels of photographers can submit entries for viewing and are eligible for all prizes and awards.
- Entries containing material considered inappropriate by the committee for public viewing for all ages will not be displayed and will be returned to the sender.
- Only two entries per category per photographer

Historic Sites:

- The Keillor House with its wonderful displays of the historic life of this Shiretown.
- The Chandler House, once the home of a Father of Confederation the Honourable Edward B. Chandler.
- The St. James Textile Museum with its many items of past crafts and life style items.
- The Bell Inn Restaurant, New Brunswick's oldest stone building (1811), which has been featured in the book "Where to eat in Canada" for 15 years.
- Take a walk along the dikes, built by the first Acadian settlers, which protect the massive marshes near the Village of Dorchester and view the location of the once very productive shipyards along the Memramcook River.

- Visit the many different churches within the village limits each with their individual architectural design.

Surrounding areas of Special Interest:

- View thousands of shore birds, the tides of the Shepody Bay and the coastline along Highway # 935 passing through Buck's Flats, Johnson's Mills and Rockport.
- Village of Memramcook with many Acadian historic sites.
- The Town of Sackville along Highway # 106, home of Mount Allison University, Waterfowl Park and the gateway to the historic windy Tantramar Marshes.
